MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR



The 2013/14 year was a memorable one, accentuated by some unusual challenges in terms of physical resilience (storms and earthquakes), and advancement or achievement of several major initiatives.

One of our largest pieces of work, the Wellington City Public Transport Spine Study, was completed, and we are now seeing the results of our investment in rail with improvements in timeliness and reliability on the metro route.

Our Draft Regional Plan, which will be the blue print for land and water management in the region, is nearing completion, and we have collaborated with other councils to integrate our bulk water supply with 'retail' water delivery services and establish Wellington Water.

How much are regional rates in 2014/15

The average regional council residential property rate in **Kapiti is \$322.79**.

The region's rate increase for **Kapiti is 6.25% or \$19** a **year (36 cents a week)** for the average value residential property.

The total increase in our rates revenue across the region this year is 5.73%.


