Mr Brent Efford, Transport 2000

Mr Efford said the draft Strategy proposals raised expectation the region could have a balanced roading and public transport system for the next 10 years and he looked forward to an involvement in achieving a sustainable transport network for the region.

Mr Efford asked whether anywhere in the world there was a programme of road building which has produced freedom from congestion, with traffic flowing freely throughout the region at all times of the day. Transport 2000 did not know of any.

Councillor McDavitt said he did not wish to consider substantive amendments to the draft Transport Strategy at today's meeting but was happy to discuss minor editorial changes to the draft.

Any substantive differences could be included as part of the submission process and organisation and groups are requested to submit their concerns in writing to the Regional Council.

Councillor McDavitt said it would be necessary to call a special meeting of the Regional Land Transport Committee to consider a process for receiving submissions on the transport strategy. The meeting will also receive the result of the Transmission Gully Willingness to Pay survey.

All submissions on the strategy would be tested by the technical group on the computer model and the challenge for submitters was to better the model contained in the draft strategy.

Members noted that Ms Warren had forwarded a fax to the Regional Council suggesting substantial and editorial changes to the draft strategy.

A copy of the fax was tabled at the meeting. Councillor McDavitt said the editorial comments would be considered by Dr Watson and himself before the public release of the strategy and the substantive recommendations should be formally presented to the Regional Council through the submission process.
