Cr Buchanan said that the current status of the Waingawa River Scheme was robust and defensible and considered that any review of the existing rating classification would be difficult to justify at present.

Paula Pickford and Nicola Saunders (Consents & Compliance Section) were present for the discussion on this item.

Messrs Alan James, Kerry Ellis (Trustees of the Castlepoint East Coast Recreation Jetty Trust) and His Worship the Mayor, Bob Francis were present for this item. The Trustees were objecting to the account received for resource consent application costs to construct a jetty at Castlepoint.

Mr James said that the Trust had been set up in late 1996 to put forward a jetty project as a fitting monument towards the millennium celebrations. Financial support for the project had been given by the Masterton District Council, Masterton Licensing Trust and the Tararua Foundation.

Mr Francis gave a background on the District Council's support towards the jetty project.

Mr James indicated that because of the financial circumstances now faced by the Trust, there were no funds available to meet the project expenses and the Trustees were requesting Council assistance for remission of the fees.

Cr Macaskill asked Mr Francis for details of the likely involvement of the Masterton District Council with the Trust's request and further requested that documentation regarding the financial status of the Trust be also made available to the Council. Both agreed to forward this to the Council.

Members noted that 1998 had been a year of extremes in the Wairarapa and potential problems existed in the eastern hill country unless substantial rainfall occurred within the next 2-3 months. River flows in 1998 in the eastern hill country had been as low as 16% of the average annual flow.
