Resolved to Recommend to Policy and Finance Committee (Cr Aitken/Cr Laidlaw)

- (1) That in relation to raw water and drinking water standards, the Utility Services Committee reports to the Policy, Finance and Strategy Committee significant concerns with:
 - (i) The lack of leadership by the three Central Government Agencies, Ministry of Health, Ministry for the Environment and The Treasury on the proposed new drinking water standards and the proposed system for the classification of catchments that provide source water for drinking purposes.
 - (ii) The lack of co-ordination by these three Central Government Agencies in developing the raw water and drinking water policies and standards.
 - (iii) The lack of confidence in Central Government's ability to communicate and listen to Regional and Local Authorities on the proposed raw water and drinking water standards.
 - (iv) The lack of comfort with the current developments in relation to the Public Health Risk Management Plans.
