FUNDING OF CHRYSTALLS BEND EXTENSION PROGRAMME

Further to your telephone conversation with Mr Warwick Read, Group Manager Finance and Corporate Services, I make the following submission in relation to the funding of the Chrystalls Bend Extension programme.

During the 04/05 review of the LTCCP the Greater Wellington Regional Council agreed to bring forward Chrystalls Bend Extension programme by 3 years, starting with the design in the 05/06 year and completing construction by 07/08 year. In recognition of the project being brought forward the Kapiti Coast District Council agreed to meet 40% of the cost of the \$1.3 million project i.e. \$520,000.

As this Council initially was of the view that the project was going to be designed and constructed in the 05/06 year, Kapiti Coast District Council included the full Council contribution of \$520,000 in its 05/06 year budget (to be funded from loans). As the project is planned to be designed and constructed over a three year period with the following budgeted costs it is suggested that the funding provided by Kapiti Coast District Council should also follow the same pattern.
